Critical pedagogy tends to accomplish this end by striving to help students “unlearn” previous lessons that may enforce dominant thought and “relearn” their own ideas. Critical pedagogy is based on the principle that students should come to their own conclusions and that there is no one “correct” interpretation of a work of art or literature.

Critical pedagogy as developed by critical literacy elements in the classroom invites and encourages students to question issues of power. These issues include multiple indicators: socioeconomic status (SES), race, class, gender, sexual orientation, and age (Cervetti, Pardales, & Damico, 2001).
